

Eccles to Winterton Sea Defences Groyne Refurbishment 2024-2025 January 2025 update

What are we telling you about?

We want to keep you up-to-date about the essential groyne refurbishment work between Eccles and Winterton, which is well underway now.

Where is this work happening?

Work is currently taking place at Eccles.

Due to weather and tidal conditions, over the next few weeks it will be necessary to work overnight and during weekends, to ensure we can complete work within the deadlines set by the Marine Management Organisation (MMO). We sincerely apologise for any disturbance or inconvenience this may cause to local residents and greatly appreciate your patience and understanding.

The groynes along this frontage help to retain beach levels that protect the sea defence wall from erosion. This is essential to protect both people and property in the area.

When is the work happening?

The Marine Management Organisation are the consenting authority and have set out some fixed dates from September 2024 to the end of March 2025.



However due to the weather and tidal conditions the works are taking longer and we have requested a variation to the consent we have with the MMO. This will be to extend the window of works at Waxham until the end of April 2025.

What will we be doing?

As you may already know, this Project involves the removal of old timber and steel groynes that have deteriorated and are now due for replacement. The new groynes are being formed using rock and are constructed on the same alignment and position as the existing groynes.

There are temporary compound areas located at both Cart Gap, Eccles-on-Sea and Poplar Farm, Waxham, which are used as a base for staff and project management.

All of the rock from Norway has now been delivered and is being collected from the foreshore and placed to form the new groynes.

We aim to keep disruption to a minimum. The beach will remain open apart from the area we are working in. Public access along the sea wall continues to be maintained. When we are working close to the wall we have staff to direct members of the public to protect them from our work. Please also look out for any safety signs.
